This student-curated exhibition — by Cameron Pauly '19, Sierra Sunshine '17, and Carrie Zhang '20 — brings together over fifty pottery objects from both the Longyear Museum of Anthropology and the Picker Art Gallery collections. Objects represent pottery making traditions from ancient to contemporary communities in South Africa, Nigeria, China, Thailand, Panama, Peru, and Native American nations and explore different phases of pottery manufacturing, including material selection, clay shaping, surface treatments, and firing. An interactive center allows visitors to practice forming clay using different shaping techniques and learn how to analyze potsherds.
