PRESENTER BIOGRAPHIES

Edna K. Akoto '05, MD, FAAP

Dr. Edna Akoto was born and raised in Kumasi, Ghana, and emigrated to the U.S. at age 11. The rest of her childhood was spent in the Bronx, NYC. After her collegiate years at Colgate, Akoto completed a postbaccalaureate program at City College-City University of New York. She graduated from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in 2011 and subsequently trained at New York Presbyterian-Columbia University in the pediatric residency program. In the years post-residency, Akoto initially worked at a community health center in the Upper West Side neighborhood in NYC and later at a small private practice in the Kingsbridge neighborhood of the Bronx. Akoto currently works for Montefiore Medical Center's School Health Program providing urgent and well-child care to students in different school settings. Her passion is in working with and caring for families from minority, uninsured, and underserved communities.

Leila Amiri, PhD

Dr. Leila Amiri serves as the associate dean for admissions and assistant professor in psychiatry at the Robert Larner, M.D., College of Medicine at the University of Vermont. She oversees admissions and recruitment for both campuses of the College of Medicine. Her commitment to a holistic review in admissions and her unwavering support for students in achieving their academic and professional goals are a testament to her passion and dedication.

Amiri began her career in higher education as an undergraduate peer adviser. Over her career, she has worked with students at seven different institutions as an adviser, faculty member, administrator, and mentor.
